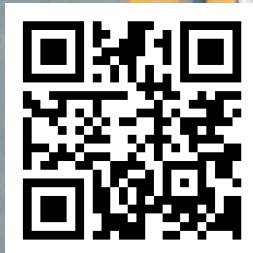

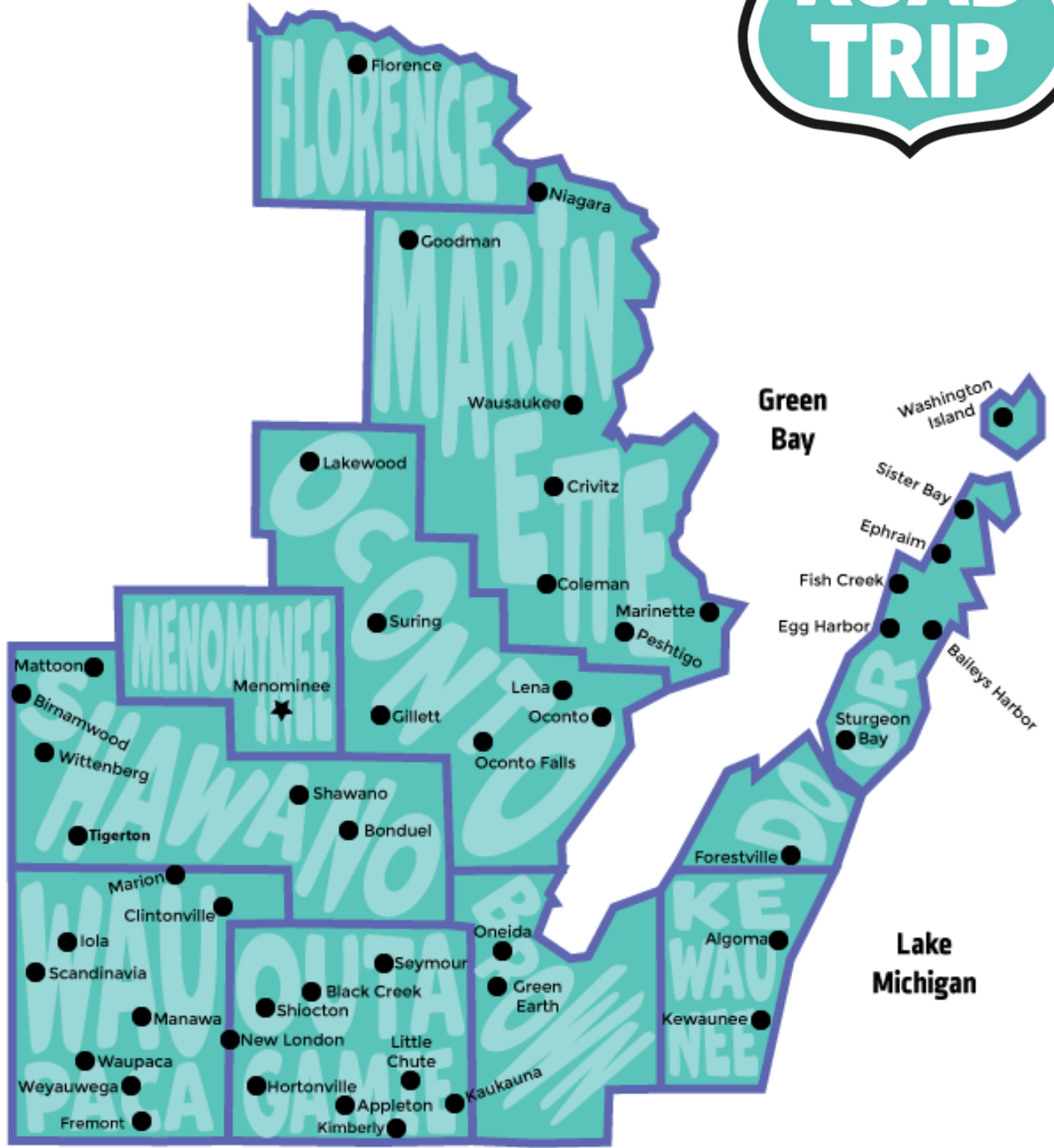

Welcome to the 2024 InfoSoup Library Road Trip!

Buckle up for a journey through the heart of Northeast Wisconsin, where 49 libraries in 10 counties await your exploration. You will discover the unique buildings, services, events, and resources available in these communities.

How to Participate

- Your road trip begins by picking up a map booklet at any participating library. Use this booklet to plan your road trip to as many of our 49 InfoSoup library locations as you can visit. You can also download a map at: infosoup.info/roadtrip. **Maps can be stamped from Memorial Day Weekend through Labor Day Weekend.**
- There are two ways that you can get your map booklet stamped:
 - Visit a participating library and do one of the following:
 - Check out an item.
 - Participate in a program or activity.
 - Post a selfie from the library using the hashtag **#LibraryRoadTrip** on Facebook.
 - Sign up to use a public computer.
 - Can't travel? Call an InfoSoup library and ask the librarian for a book or movie recommendation, or ask a question about the library or the community. You will get a secret code to add to your map. Please don't share your code.
- Only one stamp or code per patron per library.
- For every 10 stamps or codes you collect, go to an InfoSoup member library and get an entry form for a chance to win prizes. You may enter up to 4 times.
- The prize drawing will occur on **September 18, 2024**. Winners will be notified using the contact information on their entry form.

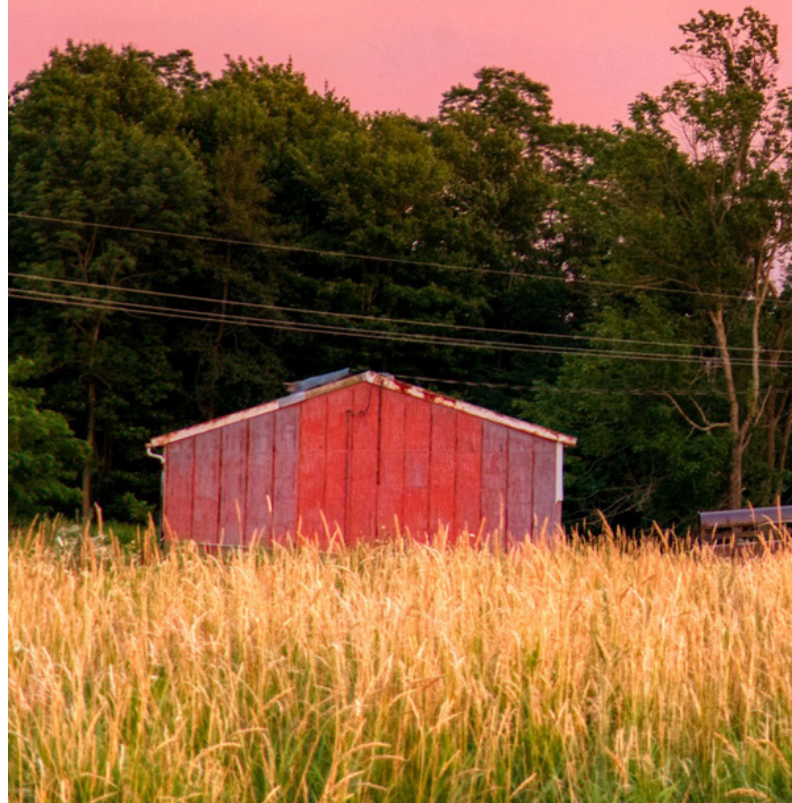

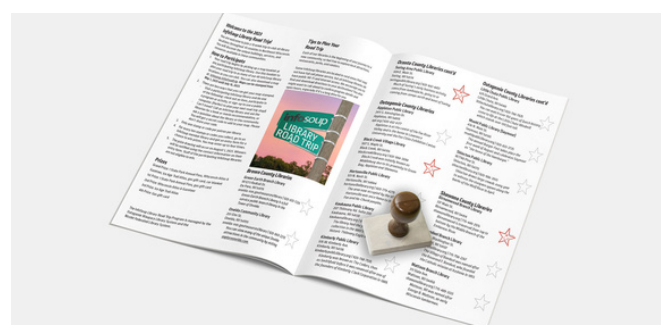
